# **Shire Admin Office Closure Over Festive Period.**

Council approved the closure of the Administration Office between Monday, 22 December 2008 to Friday, 2 January 2009 inclusive. The depot will operate with a skeleton staff to attend to rubbish collection, road signs and emergencies.

#### **Marruwayura Office**

In the near future you will see the refurbishment of the Marruwayura Office being undertaken.

The DLGRD in partnership with the Shire will lead the development of the Marruwayura Office under the co-location funded project.

Office space will be offered to the community for rent to set up or relocate existing businesses. Enquiries will be dealt with by the Shire and Michaela Maine, (DLGRD officer) will work closely with the Council to develop the short-term tenancy and long-term plans for the project.

# Petition to Legislative Assembly to have the Goldfields Highway - Wiluna to Meekatharra bitimised.

At the April 2008 Shire meeting it was resolved to adopt a petition to submit to the Legislative Assembly to have the Goldfields Highway – Wiluna to Meekatharra section bitimised. Signatures have been gathered from Wiluna and Meekatharra and sent to John Bowler, MLA. Mr Bowler has advised that it is his pleasure to present the petition to State Parliament when they resume normal operations on 11 November 2008.

## **Water Quality Improvement Program**

The CEO has met with the Water Corporation recently and they advised that the Electrodialysis Reversal (EDR) water treatment plant is on target to be in operation by the end of November 2008.

The expected outcome is that the water quality will be improved and that will have positive flow-on affects for all.

The community profile will then be passed onto the interested agencies to use for future reference. ## **Canning Stock Route Celebration**

Celebration of Wiluna's artists at Tjukurba Gallery: Telling Our Stories Through Painting: The Canning Stock Route Project

The talent of Wiluna's established and emerging artists will feature in an exhibition: Telling Our Stories through Painting: the Canning Stock Route Project, which opens at Tjukurba Gallery on Friday, 7 November 2008.

Some of the artists displaying work are taking part in a collaborative enterprise – known as *The Canning Stock Route Project* – among nine remote Aboriginal art centres and communities from the Kimberley, Midwest and Goldfields regions of Western Australia. Tjukurba Gallery is one of the art centres participating in the project.


Since 2007, artists, countrymen and custodians from these communities have been creating an unprecedented body of work which tells, for the first time, the story of the Stock Route and its impact as seen through Aboriginal eyes. This will be distilled into a major exhibition, due for launch at the National Museum of Australia in Canberra in mid 2010.



Telling Our Stories Through Painting brings together some important pieces by Wiluna artists, destined for the Canberra exhibition, and shows them alongside work by the community's emerging artists. It creates a moment which celebrates the strength and energy of Wiluna's artistic development: where it is possible to plot the trajectory from the freshness of emerging generations through to the potent work of the community's leading artists.

The exhibition opening will launch a weekend of celebration, involving the school, the Shire and the whole community in celebrating Wiluna and highlighting in particular the connections between community, corporate and Indigenous stakeholders.

A whole range of activities for 'kids of all ages' are in prospect, including a BBQ and a film night. Plans include a multimedia and history evening featuring films and photography from *The Canning Stock Route Project* and the showing of locally-sourced material. The film night will wrap up with music from a local band. See below for details.

Telling Our Stories Through Painting is designed and delivered by FORM, in partnership with the Shire of Wiluna. The show has been made possible through the support of BHP Billiton Nickel West, the Government of Western Australia's Department of Local Government and Regional Development (via WARIS).
