## Shire of Wiluna

### Capital Works Initiatives for 2012-13

This financial year will see the start of some great new projects for the Shire, three significant ones are:

- ◆ The scoping of a new Interpretive Centre based on the Canning Stock Route and the Gunbarrel Highway. A business case will be prepared from funding provided by the Mid West Development Commission for a new building within Wiluna that will be dedicated to the promotion of these iconic routes. With a steady stream of visitors to Wiluna as the starting and finishing point for both routes this facility is seen as being a boost for tourism and heritage preservation. Over 50% of the funding will be provided from the Royalties for Regions Programme through the 2012/13 Country Local Government Fund. Approvals for the use of the funding for this purpose is now being sought. Further details will be provided as the project proceeds.
- ◆ A new facility to house change rooms, toilets and a kiosk is being planned for the sports oval. Our oval is first class but lacks modern amenities and this project will add those elements that are necessary for the comfort of players, supporters, officials and spectators alike.
- ◆ The upgrading of the Shire offices will be proceeding this year to both bring the facility into a more usable and contemporary state and to ensure that the building is preserved in accordance with its heritage value. The Shire has obtained approval to use the 2011/12 CLGF for part of the cost. The initial phase has been the engagement of a heritage architect which is being funded by a special grant from the Lotteries Commission.

Future newsletters will bring you accounts of the progress of these wonderful projects.

## Bus Service

The Wiluna to Leonora six monthly trial bus service commences on Thurs 4<sup>th</sup> October for a trial period. A Toyota Hiace mini-bus which is seat belt-ed and air conditioned has been specially licenced for this run.

On Thursday mornings our bus will link with the Goldrush Tours bus at Leonora - the Goldrush Tours bus then goes on to Laverton and our bus returns to Wiluna in the afternoon.

On Friday mornings our bus will link at Leonora with the Goldrush Tours bus that travels to Kalgoorlie and our bus returns to Wiluna in the afternoon.

Our bus will depart from the Wiluna Sport and Recreation centre (only) and travel directly to Leonora via Leinster and then return on the same route.


As the bus only holds 9 passengers, plus limited luggage, early bookings are essential - payment can be made at the Shire of Wiluna offices during office hours. **BOOKINGS CAN NOW BE MADE AT THE SHIRE OFFICE**

The Public Transport Authority of WA has indicated that the standard fare one way between Wiluna and Leonora will be set at \$ 57 and the concession fare is set at \$ 35. The fare between Wiluna and Leinster is set at \$ 49 and a concession fare of \$ 29 applies.



The existing retransmission television service provided by the Shire of Wiluna will cease when the analog service is no longer available and all residents will need to prepare for the digital service.

# Do you need help to get **READY** for digital TV?

## What is the digital switchover?

Australia is switching to digital-only TV. By the end of 2013 all analog TV signals will be switched off and replaced with digital-only signals. This means that people need to make changes to their TV systems to continue to watch free-to-air TV.

To help people make the switch to digital TV, the Government has established the Household Assistance Scheme.

## What is the Household Assistance Scheme?

The Household Assistance Scheme offers installation of digital TV equipment for people to switch to digital TV. It is a safety net for those who cannot convert without additional assistance.

Under the Scheme, an Australian Government-engaged contractor will come to your home and help you get ready for digital TV by installing digital equipment. This installation is free-of-charge.

## What does the Scheme include?

The Household Assistance Scheme provides a package of assistance for eligible people including:

- Easy to use digital equipment
- In-home installation and demonstration
- 12 months aftercare support and equipment warranty.

Talking set-top boxes are available to eligible viewers who receive an eligible pension and are legally blind, or are the carer of a child registered as legally blind.

## What if I need satellite TV?

The installer will check your reception to decide if you need satellite TV. If you do, all equipment will be installed free-of-charge.

## Am I eligible?


You may be eligible for the Household Assistance Scheme if you have a functioning TV and receive the **full rate** of one of these payments:

- Age Pension
- Disability Support Pension
- Carer Payment
- Veterans' Affairs Service Pension
- Veterans' Affairs Income Support Supplement

## Is there any difference if I do not own my home?

Yes, there is. If you **do not own your own home**, or you **live in a unit**, the installer can supply and install the set-top box and upgrade the indoor antenna. They cannot make changes to your external antenna or cabling – you would need to talk to your landlord or body corporate about any upgrades.

If you **do own your home**, the installer can carry out any work necessary to help you switch to digital TV. You will need to get approval from any heritage authority or local council before external work is done on your property.

### How do I apply?

You can check your eligibility in three easy steps. It is quick and easy!

#### Step 1

Call the Department of Human Services (DHS) on **1800 556 443** between 8.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

You can also apply by visiting a DHS Service Centre.

#### Step 2

The DHS representative will ask you a few questions to check your eligibility.

#### Step 3

If you are eligible, an Australian Government-engaged contractor will call you to make an appointment to come to your home to provide you with an assistance package.

**The installer will not charge you for the installation. It is free-of-charge.**

We do not engage door-to-door salesmen and you will only be contacted to arrange an installation once you have completed the eligibility process.


### Need more information?

If you have questions about the Scheme or want to check your eligibility call **1800 556 443**.

If you are eligible, you should make sure you get in early so that your installation can be scheduled well before switchover in your area. Otherwise you may lose access to free-to-air TV if an installation cannot be arranged until after switchover.

Even if you do not think you need help, we would like to know that you are ready for switchover.

Heather will continue to visit on a regular basis, and Siobhan is on hand to keep the gallery open and running.


We are looking forward to more artists coming in to paint, so come and visit us soon.

The Shire is awaiting the arrival of our new pool manager and he will promptly be preparing the pools and grounds for the spring opening in October, date to be announced pending final clearance.



Pensioner \$2 (Concession card to be produced)






# Car Removal



The Shire removes unwanted cars from the town area 3 or 4 times a year.

Anybody wanting a car removed should write to the Shire detailing the type of vehicle, its location, any registration or identification, and ownership details. When there are sufficient requests the Shire will organise a collection at no cost. The time wait maybe up to three months for the next general collection.

Any requests for immediate removals outside of the general collection will incur a fee which will be advised and collected prior to the removal being made.



## **WILUNA REMOTE COMMUNITY SCHOOL SPORTS DAY**


The Wiluna Remote Community School held their annual Sports Day on 12 September at the Wiluna Sports Oval.

# Household Rubbish Collection



The charge for the twice weekly rubbish collection service to each property is based on (one) 240 MGB for each bin collected.

During the past year the Shire staff have noticed that on a number of occasions property owners have placed more bins out for collection than the property owner has been charged for.

In future the rubbish collector will only empty the number of bins that the property owner has been charged for in the annual rates notice. Any additional bins will not be emptied and it will be the responsibility of the property owner/occupier to take this to the Wiluna rubbish site.

If residents wish to have additional bins collected please register at the Shire office and agree to pay an additional annual cost of \$300 per 240 MGB.

**Friday: 5<sup>th</sup> Oct:** Mid-morning – Engagement with the community with the tree SFFC players available to meet interested community members.






All dog owners please note that dog registrations end on the 31st October and must be renewed after that date.


# *Wiluna Shire Library*
