COUNCIL MATTERS

-**The Wiluna Development Project** has begun with the upgrade of staffing skills using a specialist organizational person.

-**The Shire has made an offer to purchase** the Marruwayura house in Scotia St for a new staff member. The Shire has also made an offer to **lease the Marruwayura Offices** for a period of 6 months with an option to purchase after that time. This offer, if accepted, will be made on the basis that the community agrees with the idea to re use the building for the collocation of services as a town resource in the town business area. Funds are being sought for renovation work.

-**Staff Reviews** have occurred as required by the Local Government Act.

-**The new Sewerage ponds** are now extended and all old ponds are gone.

-**Negotiations for a new Liquor Accord** have begun and the Shire will be taking part

-**Magellan Mine** managers visited the Shire to let us know that they hope to begin work again in 2008 provided they get permission to move their product through Fremantle.

-**CDEP under Nooda** has been very slow to begin and we are not sure how it is going.

-**The Statue** for the entry to town featuring the story of the 'last of the Nomads' will be installed and unveiled at a ceremony at sun-down on Thursday October 4th. All invited.

-**When the Wiluna School** moves from its present site the land will be resumed by the Shire. If you have an idea or interest in the future use of the site phone or speak to a councilor. The new school is progressing well
