What does the Bush Fire Service do?

Bush Fire Service (BFS) volunteers play a significant and vital role in helping to ensure their local communities are safe.

BFS brigades are established by Local Governments to provide a volunteer fire prevention and suppression service in areas where no cover or limited cover is provided by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services' career Fire and Rescue Service, Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service, Volunteer Fire and Emergency Service or Parks and Wildlife.



Volunteers are trained and equipped to carry out a range of activities such as those listed below.

- Responding to emergencies including:
 - · bush and scrub fires;
 - · structural firefighting; and
 - · vehicle fires.
- · Fire prevention and risk management work
- Supporting other emergency services when required.



What volunteer roles are available?

Volunteers undertake various roles according to their abilities, interests, and what they are comfortable with. The different volunteer roles are listed below.

- · Community safety and education
- Leadership
- Support (incident management and communications)
- Training
- Administration

What will I be doing?

Time commitments vary between brigades but a typical commitment range is:

- One training session per fortnight
- One meeting per months
- Training that may occasionally be in another town and for 1-3 days
- Attend incidents when you are available.



Responsibilities include:

- Attending incidents whenever possible
- Following instructions given by the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer (CBFCO) and brigade officers
- Use brigade equipment and vehicles in a safe manner
- · Attend brigade meetings regularly
- Participate in training
- Maintain a reasonable level of fitness appropriate to your role within the brigade
- Maintain appliances, equipment, and personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Assist in fundraising.

Dehydration

Dehydration happens when you haven't got enough fluids in your body. If severe, dehydration can cause serious problems. If you think you or someone with you is severely dehydrated, get them to hospital.

What is dehydration?

You are dehydrated if your body doesn't have enough water to keep it working properly. It can happen when your body loses too much fluid, such as from excessive sweating.

What causes dehydration?

People can get dehydrated:

- after strenuous exercise, especially in hot weather
- · after severe vomiting or diarrhoea
- with a fever
- · after drinking too much alcohol
- while taking certain medicines such as diuretics
- · as a complication of diabetes
- · if they don't drink enough water.

Anyone may become dehydrated, but babies, young children, older adults and people with long-term illnesses are at most risk.

Dehydration signs and symptoms

If you have mild to moderate dehydration, you might

- be thirsty
- · have a dry mouth, lips and tongue
- · have a headache
- · have dark urine, and not so much of it
- · be dizzy or light-headed, particularly when standing up.

If you have severe dehydration, you might:

- be extremely thirsty
- have a very dry mouth
- be breathing fast
- · have a fast heart rate and a low blood pressure
- have a fever
- have little or no urine
- be irritable, drowsy or confused.

Babies who are dehydrated have a sunken fontanel, the soft spot on top of a baby's head. Severe dehydration is a serious problem, especially in babies and young children.

Dehydration Treatment

Mild dehydration can be fixed by drinking more fluids. The simplest approach is to put 6 teaspoons of sugar with half a teaspoon of salt in one liter of boiled water. You can also buy premade solutions from the pharmacy. Avoid alcohol and caffeine, as they can make you more dehydrated.

Severe dehydration needs immediate medical treatment, usually in hospital where fluids are given through an intravenous drip.

Dehydration Prevention

Make sure you drink enough water each day, and have extra to replace any fluid lost during hot weather, illness or exercise.

Drink lots of fluids or oral rehydration solution to treat mild to moderate dehydration. See your doctor or go to a hospital emergency room if you, your baby, child or elderly relative is severely dehydrated.





Turnbull Government enshrines better small business protections into law

25th November 2016

Durack's small businesses will have increased protections under Australian consumer law, thanks to new laws which have taken effect, Member for Durack Melissa Price has announced.

Changes to Australian unfair contract terms under consumer law will allow Australia's more than 2.1 million small businesses to have the same protections as available to consumers, following an extensive consultation and implementation period.

"This delivers upon a key election promise of the Tumbull Government and is yet another injection of confidence into Durack's small businesses," Ms Price said.

"During the past twelve months, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has worked closely with businesses to help them comply with the new law, and the Government is pleased that many large businesses have reviewed their standard form contracts ahead of the changes commencing."

It is estimated Australia's more than 2.1 million small businesses enter into an average of eight standard contracts each year.

Under the new law, a small business will be able to have an unfair term in a standard form contract declared void by a Court if, at the time of agreeing to the contract, it had fewer than 20 employees and the contract did not exceed \$300,000 (or \$1 million for contracts longer than 12 months).

Federal Small Business Minister Michael McCormack said the stronger laws will ensure a level playing field for Australian small businesses.

"The extension of the unfair contract term protections provides a 'fair go' for small businesses, giving them extra protection when contending with 'take it or leave it' contracts. The changes ensure small businesses have access to a level playing field to compete, invest and grow," Mr McCommack said

A standard form contract is one which has been prepared by one party to the contract and where the other party has little or no opportunity to negotiate the terms.

Ms Price said a fair deal for small business is central to the Turnbull Government's economic plan.

Nuts & Bolts

Ingredients:


- 250g butter
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 500g Kellogg's Nutri-Grain
- 500g salted mixed nuts

Method:

Melt oil & butter together over low heat. Add Worcestershire sauce, garlic salt, paprika & cayenne pepper to butter/oil mixture.

Combine Nutri-Grain & nuts & bake in a slow oven (125c) for approx 1 hour, turning every 15 minutes with egg slice. Allow to cool before serving. Store in an air-tight container.



The Nationals WA unanimously support right to veto for landowners

The Nationals WA have unanimously supported landowner's rights to veto onshore oil and gas exploration and production on private land at the Party's 2016 State Conference at the weekend.

A motion supporting amendments to the Western Australian Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967 to include a right to veto to protect landholder's interests from exploration and production by commercial onshore oil and gas operators was carried without opposition at the Conference.

Member for North West Central, Vince Catania said the outcome was a major win for landholders, and if implemented would afford them the same right to veto over the petroleum industry afforded under the Mining Act 1978.

"The Nationals WA strongly support the landholders having the right to choose whether to allow gas exploration and production on their property," Vince said.

"This is a significant outcome and will serve as a key platform for the Party's position in the lead up to the 2017 State election."

Vince said The Nationals WA were committed to ensuring landholders have a right to veto onshore gas exploration.

"There has been clear community concern about the potential development of the onshore gas industry in WA," Vince added.

"Giving landholder's the right to veto onshore gas exploration and production is an effective way to maintain their property rights.

"If elected in March 2017, The Nationals WA will vigorously pursue this important reform on behalf of WA landholders."
