COUNCIL MATTERS

- -Honeymoon Wells Nickel Mine, previously owned by Lion Ore has been purchased by a Russian company. Their intentions are not known at this stage.
- -Apex Mining, the current owners of Wiluna Gold have begun planning for possible transportation of ore from the Gidgee mine for crushing at Wiluna Gold. They have been made aware of the need to upgrade the road according to Main Roads specifications.
- **-DHW.** Residents who have housing concerns can contact Gwen Rakabula at her Shire office for assistance. DHW provides funds for the Homemaker position and a house for that staff member.
- -The Governor General Michael Jeffrey has been invited to visit the new school next year.
- -The Minister for Local Government has received a complaint from a member of the public about the state of some dwellings in Wiluna.
- -Council has approved examination of the old school site as an additional Caravan Park. There has been consultation with a number of agencies but there has been a general reluctance to commit to funding of programs in the building which are old and require high maintenance costs. Advice from tourism surveys indicates a need to meet current and projected tourist requirements. If the development is successful there may be an opportunity for the Caravan Park to be leased as a business at a later date.
- -Tjukurba Gallery Artists will paint 16 panels as part of the new school entry area for which funding has been provided by the school architects. Please note, artists are no longer paid in advance for any art work.

Saturday will soon be open with the assistance of Greg Keates from the Wiluna Police. Greg has recently qualified as a swimming pool attendant through the Royal Life Saving Association. Meleonie Nariro and Raymond Anderson who work at the Swimming Pool and the Recreation Centre have recently completed their Senior First Aid qualification.

Pool water is tested three times a day for chlorine levels. Once a month samples are sent to a Perth laboratory for testing. All test results have been very good,

The Wiluna Swimming Pool was built at a cost of \$1.5 million and is fully paid for. Part of the cost was funded by donations from Mines and the Department of Sport and Recreation. For general information the previous council in 2003 had plans for a pool costing \$4.5 million. These plans were scrapped by the new council in 2004 in the interests of fiscal responsibility because it would have required borrowings in excess of \$3 million.
