## **CEO's Report**

As the 2016/17 financial year comes to a close, the Shire is busy planning for the new year. The noteworthy projects that are expected to be included in the Draft Budget will be the opening of the newly renovated Heritage & Interpretive Centre's Art Gallery next month, renovation of the Club Hotel building and the long-awaited upgrade of the main street project that should be completed by year end.

Unfortunately, with the change in State Government there is now serious concerns over the funding for the sealing of the Goldfields Highway between Wiluna and Meekatharra. The Shire will still advocate for this project due to its benefits to the local community with regards to public safety, access to services and substantial economic development.

The Shire President, Deputy President and Chief Executive Officer took the opportunity to visit Parliament House after the Developing Northern Australia Conference 2017 to lobby a number of politicians with the intention to discuss enhancing government services, improve local infrastructure and highlight a number of significant economic development opportunities. These meeting were considered to be successful with a number of the politicians promising to visit Wiluna within the coming months.

Last month the Shire held a successful NAIDOC Week event at the Wiluna Recreation Centre. The Shire is hoping to make this an annual event due to the importance of NAIDOC Week to the local community. Shire staff enjoyed providing the tasty feast and various activities which included face painting for the children. The event was well attended by the Wiluna community and the Shire welcomes the very positive feedback it has received about this event. Special thanks must go to Blackham Resources for the donation of three specially decorated cakes.

Sara Walker (pictured) will be joining the team at the Shire of Wiluna and will be managing the gallery and the Heritage and Interpretive Centre.



They have done a fantastic job and the new Heritage and Interpretive Centre will soon be opening.







The aim of our program is to achieve an overall participation rate of 70% of women aged 50-74 years.

The participation rate is calculated as the proportion of eligible women in the target age group screened at least once over a 24-month period.

Wiluna visit covers the Statistical Local Area (SLA) of Wiluna. The estimated female resident population\* of this SLA for the target age group is 70. In the last 24 months 59% of the total target population (50-74 years) in this SLA have attended screening.



The Canning Stock Route is a track that runs from Halls Creek in the Kimberley region of Western Australia to Wiluna in the mid-west region. With a total distance of around 1,850 km (1,150 mi) it is the longest historic stock route in the world.

The stock route was proposed as a way of breaking a monopoly that west Kimberley cattlemen had on the <u>beef</u> trade at the beginning of the 20th century. In 1906, the <u>Government of Western Australia</u> appointed <u>Alfred Canning</u> to survey the route. When the survey party returned to <u>Perth</u>, Canning's treatment of <u>Aboriginal</u> guides came under scrutiny leading to a <u>Royal Commission</u>. Canning had been organising Aboriginal hunts to show the explorer where the waterholes were. Despite condemning Canning's methods, the Royal Commission, after the Lord Mayor of Perth, <u>Alexander Forrest</u> had appeared as a witness for Canning, exonerated Canning and his men of all charges. The cook who made the complaints was dismissed and Canning was sent back to finish the job.

Canning was appointed to lead a construction party and between March 1908 and April 1910, 48 wells were completed along the route. Commercial <u>droving</u> began in 1910, but the stock route did not prove popular and was rarely used for the next twenty years. The wells made it difficult for Aboriginal people to access water and in reprisal they vandalised or dismantled many of the wells.

A 1928 Royal Commission into the price of beef in Western Australia led to the repair of the wells and the re-opening of the stock route. Around 20 droves took place between 1931 and 1959 when the final droving run was completed.


The Canning Stock Route is now a popular but challenging <u>four-wheel drive</u> trek typically taking 10 to 20 days to complete. A few adventurers have traversed the track on foot, by bicycle, and in <u>two-wheel drive</u> vehicles.

There are two small settlements on the track where fuel and other supplies may be obtained; <u>Kunawarritji</u> approximately 1,000km north of <u>Wiluna</u> and <u>Billiluna</u> 173km south of <u>Halls Creek</u>.

The building of the stock route impacted on the cultural and social life of the more than 15 Aboriginal language groups and today the Aboriginal history of the track, recorded through oral and artistic traditions, is increasingly being recognised.


# Sudoku



After thinking for a moment, the woman drops her towel and stands naked in front of Bob.


After a few seconds, Bob hands her \$800 dollars and leaves. The woman wraps back up in the towel and goes back upstairs.

# Healthy Cooking for Healthy Kids Zucchini Chips



Ingredients—4 zucchini/ / 1 cup breadcrumbs / 3/4 cup parmesan (grated) / 1 tbs fresh mixed herbs (chopped) / 1 egg (beaten) / 1/3 cup milk / 1/3 cup plain flour Serves 4



Preheat oven to 220°C (200°C fan-forced). Wash zucchini and cut in half lengthwise, then in half or thirds again, depending on how tick. If zucchini are extra long, you can halve them horizontally as well.

Make coating by combining breadcrumbs with parmesan and herbs. Season well. Combine egg and milk together in a separate bowl.





Coat zucchini by first dusting pieces lightly in flour. Then dip in the egg mix. Finally, coat well with bread-crumb mixture.

Place crumbed zucchini on an oven tray lined with baking paper. Bake for 20-25 minutes until golden and crispy. Serve with a dipping sauce of your choice.
