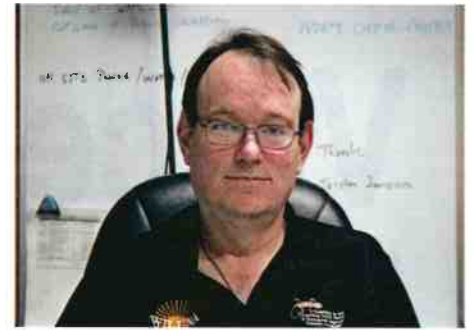

CEO's Report

The festive season is upon us all again, so on behalf of the Shire, I would like to wish everyone a happy and safe Christmas and New Year. The Shire's Administration Centre will be closing down on the 21 December 2017 and reopening on the 8 January 2018. The Wiluna Public Swimming Pool and refuse collection service will only be closed on Christmas Day (25 December 2017).

During this 2017, the Shire has commenced some exciting projects:

- Renovation works have started on the former Club Hotel Building; these works are designed to turn the building into the Shire's New Administration Centre. This redevelopment will include the construction of a Function Centre which is intended to be used by the public.
 - Planning has commenced for the development of Wiluna's main street. Once Council has endorsed a preferred design, the Shire will seek comment on the design from the local community.
- 5 x additional Shire residential housing is expected to be built in Wiluna once the Shire secures suitable funding for the project. The residential houses will be constructed at various locations around the Wiluna townsite, with a majority of the houses expected to be close to the Fire Station.

Now that the Shire Ranger had been trained in animal control, the next phase in reestablishing stronger animal control processes within Wiluna will be the impoundment of all wandering dogs in or around the Wiluna townsite. To this end, in early 2018, the Shire will be impounding any unaccompanied dogs who are found to be wandering the streets of Wiluna. Under the Dog Act, there are heavy penalties that need to be paid before an impounded dog can be released, which includes the registration of the dog. Therefore, to avoid these fines and ensure your pet are safe, the Shire strongly recommends that all dogs are always kept in a secure yard.

Council has recently supported Belgravia Leisure's recommendation to change the Wiluna Public Swimming Pool's opening hours. The changes were made to ensure the Wiluna Public Swimming Pool is open during periods of higher usage by the public. This is a good opportunity to remind everyone that the Shire does not charge entry to the Wiluna Public Swimming Pool, it is FREE to use.

The Shire will once again take over the organising of the Wiluna Annual Christmas Party. Over the past two years, the Wiluna Remote Community School had kindly organised this important event, which they all deserve many thanks for their efforts. This year the Wiluna Christmas Party will be held on the town oval on 11 December 2017 between 5.30 pm and 8.00 pm. Everybody is welcome to attend this free community event. There have been a rumour that a very special person from the north pole will also be attending.

VC Hero Inspires Students

A visit from an inspiring war hero this week coincided with the celebration of 15 students in a remote community in Wiluna who completed their first TAFE certificates.

The Wiluna Remote Community School Training Centre was established in June in partnership with the Shire of Wiluna and the Department of Education.

In that time the centre has overseen 15 students complete 22 courses through Central Regional TAFE — 15 in Certificate I in Automotive Training and seven in Conservation and Land Management.

Victoria Cross recipient Keith Payne visited the community on Monday, with close friend and training centre co-ordinator Mac Jensen, to meet students and see what the small community was able to achieve.

Mr Jensen said the war veteran was a strong advocate for Aboriginal training, education and employment and was a source of inspiration for the students.

“Keith and I are very similar people, we regard it as a great privilege to be welcomed into another culture,” he said.

“We believe everyone deserves a fair go and, not that people aren’t trying, but it is very difficult to achieve equal opportunities living in a remote community.

“The more and more remote you get, the gap widens in education and employment opportunities. We believe in bridging that gap and we are able to do that.

“Wins are hard to come by, but when you do, like these certificates, it is an amazing sense of achievement.”

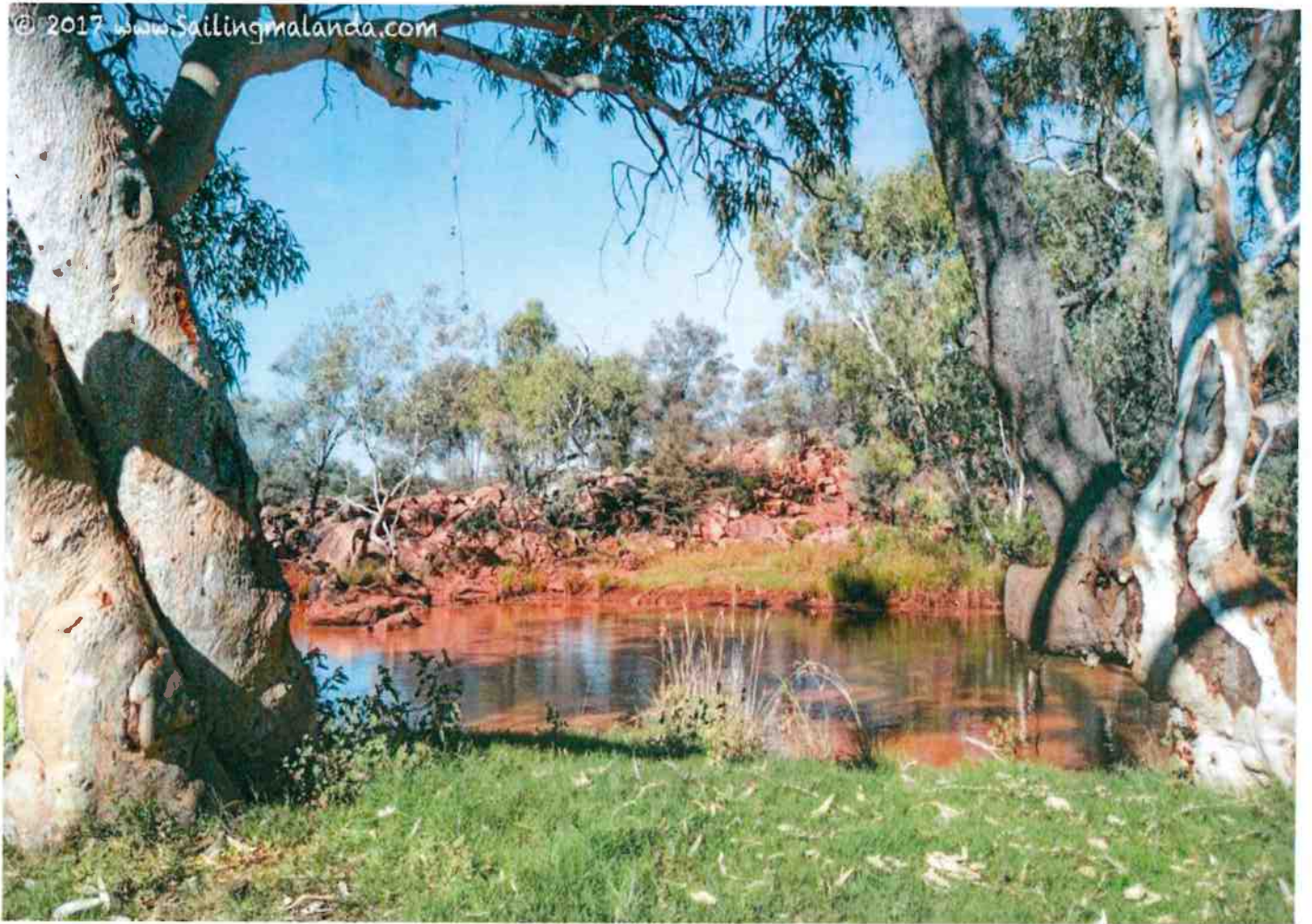
CRT lecturers from Kalgoorlie visited the community for one week each month during the school term.

Notice of an application for determination of native title in the state of Western Australia



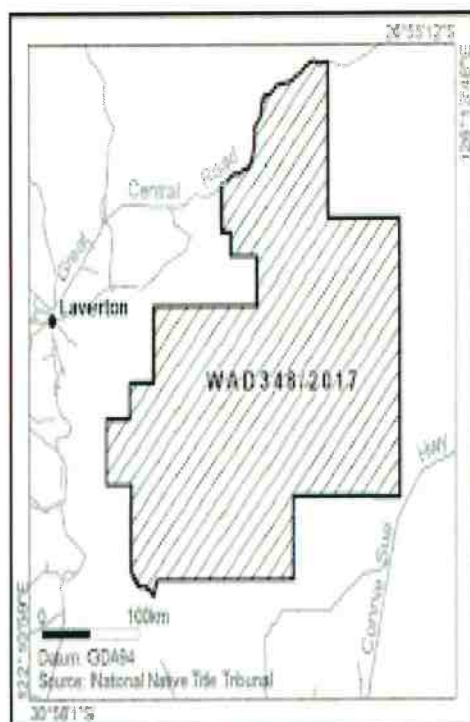
National Native Title Tribunal

Notification day: 13 December 2017

This is an application by a native title claim group which is asking the Federal Court of Australia (Federal Court) to determine that the group holds native title in the area described below.

A person who wants to become a party to this application must write to the Registrar of the Federal Court, GPO Box A30, Perth, WA, 6837 on or before 12 March 2018. After 12 March 2018, the Federal Court's permission to become a party is required.

Under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) there can be only one determination of native title for a particular area. If a person with native title rights and interests does not become a party to this application, there may be no other opportunity for the Federal Court, in making its determination, to take into account those native title rights and interests in relation to the area concerned.



Application name: Nanatadjarra People

Federal Court File No: WAD348/2017

Date filed: 7 July 2017

Registration test status: The Native Title Registrar has *not accepted* this application for registration.

Although this application has not been registered, the Federal Court may still refer the application for mediation and/or make a determination in relation to it.

Description: The application area covers about 57143 sq km approximately 80 km South East of Laverton.

Relevant LGA: Shire Of Laverton, Shire Of Menzies and City Of Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

Public comment is invited in relation to the proposed wind-up of the Wiluna Land Conservation District Committee (LCDC).

LCDC's are statutory bodies formed under section 23 of the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945*. Their functions include undertaking land conservation works, promoting soil conservation programs and providing advice to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development on land use issues within their districts.

The LCDC is proposed to be abolished because of lack of interest.

If you wish to comment on this proposal, please write to the Commissioner by 30 December 2017. All comments received will be presented to the Minister for Agriculture and Food before the LCDC is formally wound-up.

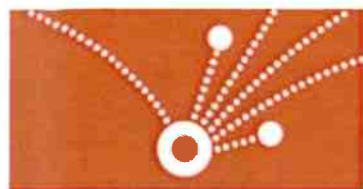

Christmas Recipes

Cheat's Christmas Shortbread

This simple shortbread recipe is as buttery and melt-in-the-mouth as any fancy traditional recipe. Whip up a batch and wrap them for Christmas.

Makes: 24 Prep: 0.10min Cook: 0.35

Ingredients

125g Caster Sugar
125g Cornflour
2 Cups of Plain Flour
250g Butter

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 170 °C.
2. Mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl. Add the melted butter and stir until it's all combined.
3. Line a 28cm x 18cm lamington tin with baking paper and press the mixture in.
4. Bake at 170° for 30 minutes.
5. Remove from oven, cut into 24 squares, sprinkle evenly with caster sugar and prick each piece with a fork.
6. Return to the oven for 15 minutes. Cool in the tin.



Notes

Don't skip the final step of cutting and returning the Shortbread to the oven.

NAN'S MERINGUE

PREPARATION: 10min ~ COOK: 1hr 30min ~ READY IN: 1hr 45min

INGREDIENTS

(SERVES 4)

6 egg whites
9 ounces or 255 g sugar
2 tsp malt vinegar
1 tsp vanilla essence
150 g whipped cream, to serve
1 punnet strawberries
Mint, to garnish

DIRECTIONS

Pre--heat the oven to 150 degrees celsius. Remove egg yolks from the eggs being careful not to get any yolk in the whites.

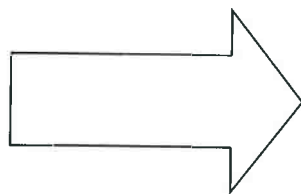
Put all the ingredients into a mixing bowl and beat on high for around 12-14 minutes

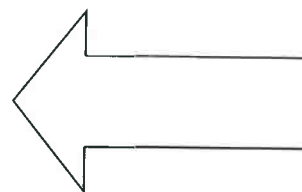

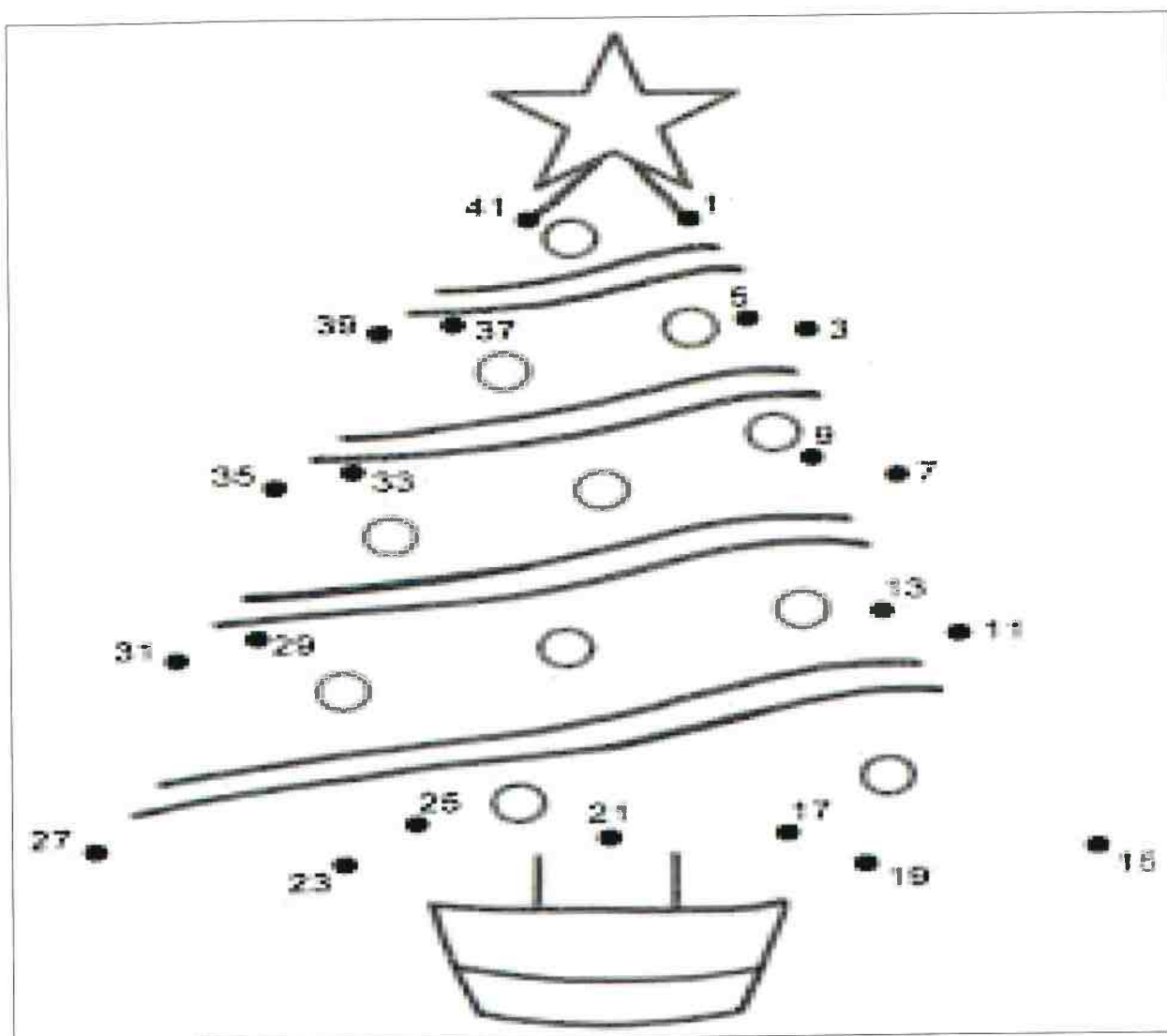
