The Shire is required to advertise its intention to borrow which must be done immediately.

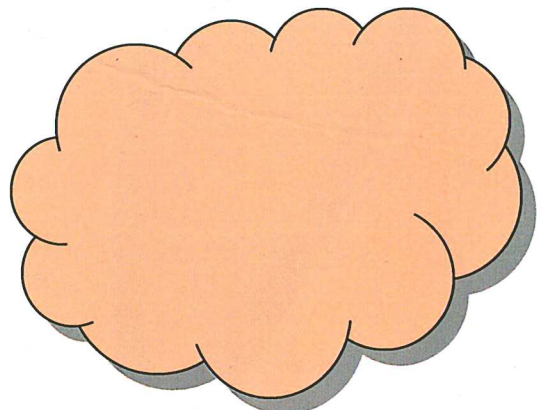

Everyone Welcome

Anzac Day is one of Australia's most important national commemorative occasions. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.

The 25th of April was officially named Anzac Day in 1916. "ANZAC" stands for Australian and New Zealand Army Corps.

On the 25th of April 1915, Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of the allied expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula. These became known as Anzacs and the pride they took in that name continues to this day.

On the morning of 25th of April 1915, the Anzacs set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula in order to open the Dardanelles to the allied navies. The objective was to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul in Turkey), the capital of the Ottoman Empire, and an ally of Germany.

The Anzacs landed on Gallipoli and met fierce resistance from the Ottoman Turkish defenders. Their plan to knock Turkey out of the war quickly became a stalemate, and the campaign dragged on for eight months.

At the end of 1915, the allied forces were evacuated. Both sides suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships. Over 8,000 Australian soldiers were killed. News of the landing on Gallipoli and the events that followed had a profound impact on Australians at home. The 25th of April soon became the day on which Australians remember the sacrifice of those who had died in the war.

The Anzacs were courageous and although the Gallipoli campaign failed in its military objectives, the Australian and New Zealand actions during the campaign left us all a powerful legacy.

With the coming of the Second World War, Anzac Day also served to commemorate the lives of Australians who died in that war. The meaning of Anzac Day today includes the remembrance of all Australians killed in military operations.

A typical Anzac Day ceremony may include the following features: an introduction, hymn, prayer, an address, laying of wreaths, a recitation, the Last Post, a period of silence, either the Rouse or the Reveille, and the national anthem. Rosemary is also traditionally worn on Anzac Day, and sometimes on Remembrance Day. Rosemary has particular significance for Australians as it is found growing wild on the Gallipoli peninsula. Since ancient times, this aromatic herb has been believed to have properties to improve the memory.

Microchipping and registration is compulsory in Western Australia.

WA Ranger Services arrived last week – over the 1 & 1/2 week period over 14 dogs were handed over in the first 2 days, all dogs in Wiluna that were home when the ranger visited were treated for ticks.

If you are a pet owner, be responsible and register your dog or cat.

Supply and install 1 x spoon drain at rear of kennels plumbed to a septic tank

Supply and install 1 x 1520mm diameter concrete domestic septic tank

Supply and install 1 x 6m leach drain to service new Dog Pound

Allowance of any plant machinery.

Allowance of hard or rock excavation

All affected area to be cleaned up and make good

The successful contractor will be responsible for the submission of an application to construct or install an apparatus for the treatment of sewage along with a block plan indicating location of septic system with compliant setbacks from boundaries and nearby structures.

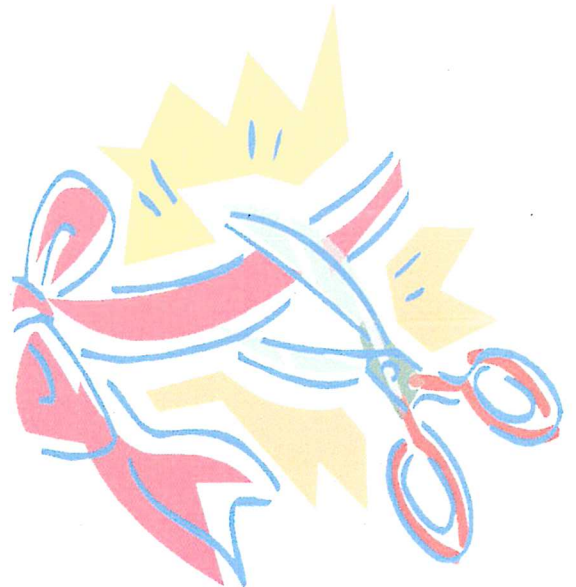
VOLUNTEERS WANTED

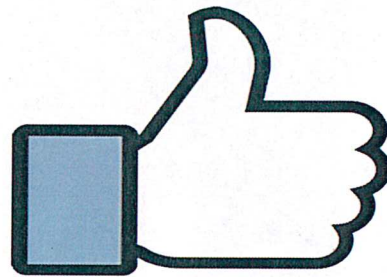

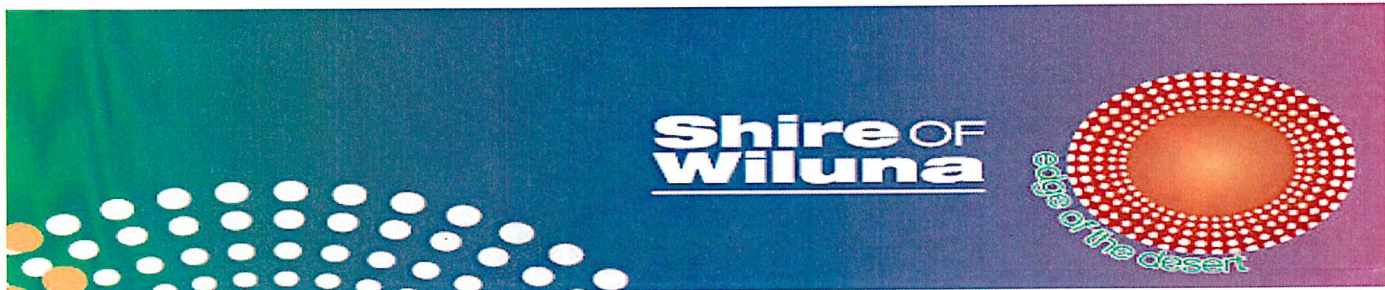
