Premiers Visit

The Premier Hon Colin Barnett MLA visited Wiluna on Wednesday 5th July 2012.

The main purpose of his visit was to present the Ngangganawili Health Service with a cheque to assist with services to be provided from the new medical centre which is being constructed on land adjoining the Shire office. The Council was given the opportunity to meet with Mr Barnett and during the short time with him raised the following:-

- Sealing of the section of the Goldfields Highway between Meekatharra and Wiluna.
- The lack of land for housing and industry in Wiluna and the time it is taking the Department of Lands to address this matter.
- Funding for the new medical centre. Council has been advised that due to lack of funds the opening of the new centre will be delayed.
- Problems with the RPT air service to Wiluna including the unavailability of flights and the constant irregular arrivals and departures.

The Premiers response to the above was very positive and Council is confident that solutions will be found to resolve the concerns raised.

Nominations opened on 17th May 2012 and closed at 4.00 pm on Thursday 24th May 2012.


Only one nomination was received from Kimely Ovens, "Mt. Russell Waters" Wiluna.

The fourth annual 2012 cultural football weekend between the Wiluna Martu Eagles and the Dalkeith / Nedlands Junior Football Club Eagles has been held, played and won for the fourth successive year.

The Wilson – Dawson perpetual cup is the weekends jewel in the crown and named aptly after Mr Mick Wilson and Mr Peter Dawson the catalysts of this engaging event. The event has grown exponentially since its inception in 2009 and has developed into much more than just a football match.

This year's event titled, "The Wiluna Martu Eagles Fly Home" was conducted in Wiluna and its surrounding areas over the first ever Western Australia Day long weekend in June and coincided with National Reconciliation Week. Over 120 players, parents and supporters made the trip to the desert to participate in the four day carnival.

Mr Mick Wilson, Executive Director of Golden West Resources Limited, in a letter to the Shire made the following comments:

"The 1st to 4th of June event was a tremendous success; highlights being; the cultural awareness program run by CDNTS followed by the Jundee Mine tour on the Saturday and of course the big game on the Sunday. Whilst this year the Martu Eagles were victorious (115 to 38) the spirit showed by both communities was the main driver for the weekend.

We were lucky enough for both Grant Dorrington and Larry Kickett of the WA football commission to attend the event and their support has already made an impact on the Wiluna community.





The event would have not been possible without community support and particularly that of BHP who donated flights from Perth for the DNJFC and for the 11 young men and women from Wiluna who attend Clontarf Aboriginal College in either Perth or Albany and are part of the Murlpirrmarra Connection program. The Murlpirrmarra Connection programme for Wiluna / Martu youth commenced in 2009 with 3 boys and has now gorwn to 15 boys and 2 girls attending boarding school in years 8 to 12. The program has been a tremendous success with the kids maturing into confident young adults and this year should see your first year 12 graduate."

The Australian Bureau of Statistics has recently provided the Shire with information obtained from the 2011 census:-

Overview of Wiluna

- * The Wiluna Shire has a UR (usual residence) population of 1,159 and a place of enumeration population of 2,016 (a difference of 857 people)
- * UR population increased from 681 to 1,159 (70.2%) from 2006 to 2011
- * The ratio of male to females was 2.4
- * The median age was 34
- * The indigenous population was 292 which was 25.2% of the total population
- * Median weekly personal income was \$1,667
- * Median weekly household income was \$1,278

Wiluna to Kalgoorlie Bus Service



Arrangements have now been completed for the commencement of the weekly bus service from Wiluna to Kalgoorlie for a trial period of six months.

The first service will commence in early August. Please make enquiries at the Shire office if you wish to use the service.

Tickets are available for purchase from the Shire Office, Scotia Street, Wiluna, during the hours of 8.30 am to 4.00 pm Monday to Friday (except public holidays). Bookings will not be accepted until full payment is made.

The Wiluna-Leonora route will connect to the existing service Kalgoorlie-Laverton by the "Goldrush Tours" bus at Leonora.

The weekly timetable is proposed to depart from Kalgoorlie 9.00 am Thursday, arriving in Leonora at 11.45am and then onto Wiluna, arriving at 4.00 pm. The proposed return trip departs Wiluna on Friday at 7.30am, arriving in Leonora at 11.30am and arriving in Kalgoorlie at 2.15 pm.

Wiluna Bush Fire Brigade

Changes to TV broadcasting to affect Wiluna

There are changes coming to Wiluna's television reception. As you may be aware Australia is progressively changing from analogue to digital TV transmission – this is currently underway in WA. This change is expected to happen in Wiluna in 2013 and from then the only TV reception will be via a satellite system.

The Australian Government will be operating The Satellite Subsidy Scheme (SSS) which provides a subsidy for eligible households to switch to satellite TV via the Viewer Access Satellite Television Service (VAST). This information has been copied from the Digital Ready website, mySwitch.

The subsidy greatly reduces your cost to get ready for digital TV. After the subsidy, the household contribution for installation of the VAST service is expected to be between \$200 and \$350, depending on your location. The subsidy will be the same amount for all eligible households in each subsidy area.

The SSS will be rolled out progressively across Australia. When rolled out to your area, you must confirm eligibility for your household by applying online on this website or calling the Digital Ready Information line on 1800 20 10 13 (8am – 10pm AEST, 7 days).

VAST is a satellite TV service which covers all of Australia. It is a direct to home digital service which provides the same number of channels available in capital cities in both standard and high definition. It also includes a channel for local news services.

The Government is funding VAST to service areas of remote Australia currently serviced by the Aurora satellite service (which currently only transmits four TV channels); areas previously serviced by self-help facilities; and to provide services to people living in any area where a good, reliable digital television signal cannot be provided terrestrially.

The Council has informally discussed these changes and is aware that this change may cause some financial burdens in this small community. The matter will be tabled by Council in due course and the possibility of further subsidy to households discussed.
