

### **CEO's Report**

On behalf of the Shire, I would like to wish everyone a happy and safe Christmas and New Year. Don't forget the annual Wiluna Christmas Party which will be held at the Wiluna Public Swimming Pool on the 12 December 2018 between 5 and 8pm.

Northern Star Resources have made an exciting proposal to the Shire for the creation of a Go-kart track for the benefit and reward of the local youth. The proposed location of the Go-kart track is at the old race course. The Shire is undertaking the required advertising of a potential lease of a portion of the Recreation Reserve to facilitate the construction of the track. Further details about the proposed lease can be found on page 7.

The Shire has recently experienced issues with its rubbish truck which is currently being repaired in Leinster. Fortunately, the Shire has been able to rent another rubbish truck to undertake the weekly collection service. A replacement rubbish truck has been included in this year's budget and a search for a suitable replacement is already underway.

The Shire will be call for tender submissions on the upgrade of the main street of Wiluna (Wotton Street). This has been a long overdue project which will continue the beautification of the town. A copy of the approved design is in the foyer of the new Administration Centre.

Another exciting project that is being progressed by the Shire, is the upgrading of the playground equipment which is located next to the Wiluna Public Swimming Pool. The purpose of the upgrade is to provide modern playground equipment that can encourage both the physical and mental abilities of the youth in Wiluna.

NAHS is also wanting to provide playground equipment for up to six-year old at its Parenting Centre (Kindergarten). The Shire will be focusing on providing playground equipment to older children. Both projects will work hand in hand and will provide most children in town with an opportunity to play in a safe and supportive environment.


#### Notice of Proposed Disposition of Property

(Section 3.58, Local Government Act 1995)

Notice is hereby given that the Shire of Wiluna proposes to dispose of approximately 1.5 hectares of land as depicted below to Northern Star Resources Limited (ACN 092 832 892) by way of a lease for a term of four years.

The land is part of Recreation Reserve 42639. Other details are as follows:

- The purpose of the lease will be the establishment of a Go Kart facility.
- The lessee will be responsible for the cost of establishing the facility, and all outgoings in relation to operation of the Go Kart facility (including insurance).
- The rent will be set at \$1.00 per year.
- A management valuation has estimated the value of the disposition as \$10,000.00

# Recreation & Leisure Coordinator Report

The Rec Centre was open for a total of 18 days this month, due to me being on holidays and the pool season in full swing. The Centre was opened from 4.40 to 7.00pm Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays. As Lester takes Wednesdays off the Rec Centre is open from 3.00pm. The children have spent the month playing basketball, along with inside activities like pool and building with the Lego Blocks. I have noticed on my arrival back from leave that the young men have been accessing the oval to organize a game of footy. The fact they are taking this task on without adults organizing it for them is a positive step. Numbers have been down based on the children using the pool during the afternoon, however we have had a steady group wondering down from 4.30pm. Friday's movie afternoon saw 21 children drop in to enjoy the movie and popcorn. We showed Oz the Great and Powerful. Popcorn generally ends with a mess on the floor and it is pleasing to say that we had minimal mess and the children are all getting used to throwing their rubbish in the bin and keeping the space they are using clean and tidy.

Circuits have continued to run this month, with the team taking it upon themselves to put in a couple of sessions while I was on leave. Since my return we have had 3 classes with a total of 15 participants. We continue to have folks from the mine coming to class, at this stage we have had school teachers, NAHS workers, locals, tradies and shire workers take advantage of the classes we have run over the last few months.

Julie and I have been working on the Community Christmas Party details over the last month, with Cater Care Blackhams catering company providing the food for this Christmas celebration. We will be holding this event at the pool and there will be pool games that Lester will run. Toby Zhang, a slight of hand magician, will be there to entertain the children and adults. Wade and his crew will be there with their flashing lights so the children can view the fire trucks and ambulance. We still have a few minor details to knock off the list before 12 December 2018.

Since my return I have put together an events calendar kicking off from February 2019, so apart from the usual trash and treasures we have been running we will also be running a monthly event. The program consist of Bingo, Karaoke and Quiz nights. We will also be running community Barbeques for all the service providers, volunteers, circuit club members and station owners. Getting together in a social way gives us all the opportunity to relax and enjoy each other's company, at times we can be so busy that when we bump into each other in a work capacity we do not take the time out to really get to know each other.

I will be running Wednesday matinee's at the Rec Centre for the old folk. I have spoke to the HACC crew and they are happy to help with this program and it will start in February 2019 and run though to November 2019.

I have spoken to the artist group regarding taking part in the Naidoc poster competition and I also have a youth interested in taking part. If anyone else is interested in this competition, came on down and see me at the Rec Centre. My door is always open.





# Wiluna Remote Community School (WRCS) Training Centre News for November 2018

The WRCS Training Centre has been busy during October and November with our Cert I Automotive course which will run through until December. Once again we Have a mixture of WRCS High School Vocational Education and Training (VET) Students, adult students from DSS and adults from the Community. It's a terrific group who train and learn very well together.

The students have been servicing vehicles and trailers, and learning about hand and power tools in the workshop. We've been very happy with their motivation and how well they are doing.

November was a very big month for the Training Centre and students.

The students completed their vehicle project where they've got an old Toyota Land Cruiser going. They've got the engine working again, replaced the suspension and put new tyres on the rims. The final piece in the jigsaw was completed when an old tray was found in the scrub and fitted to the vehicle, which required a lot of effort and ingenuity. This vehicle will now be used out on country by DSS for weed spraying and other important land management activities.

In November, the students also participated in a large DSS on-country land management activity. They got to see some new country and work closely with DSS Rangers, who are students on the course and with contractors working for the Goldfields Nullarbor Rangelands Biosecurity Association (GNRBA), who partnered with DSS for the on-country land management activity. Wiluna Shire contributes significant support to regional biosecurity, which included this activity, so a great result for all of these organisations, and a fantastic training and learning experience for the VET and TAFE students; not only visiting a large land management activity, but actively participating in it. They also leant the importance of keeping vehicles, trailers and other automotive equipment going on these large remote operations.

The course wraps up with a final delivery in early December. Next year CRTAFE will deliver a Certificate 11 in Rural Operations (Cert II Rural Ops) for the school VET and adult TAFE students at the WRCS Training Centre. Alwyn will be running this course.

Thank you Alwyn for delivering another great CRTAFE nationally accredited training course into Wiluna. It have been Mayla learning and training for the Wiluna students. Thanks also to Mitch, Michelle, Debbie, Allison and the many Kalgoorlie CRTAFE staff supporting the remote delivery into Wiluna. A lot of work happens behind the scenes to keep this training going.

Thank you to everyone supporting us, including CRTAFE, Wiluna Shire, Blackhams Resources, Golden West Resources, Goldfield Nullarbor Rangelands Biosecurity Association (GNBRA) and the Wiluna community and families. Your encouragement and support has been vital in keeping us going and achieving these tangible training results for the community.

We capped the month off with a terrific win in the prestigious WA Education Department Excellence in Education Awards. Wiluna Remote Community School won the WA Premiers Excellence in Aboriginal Education Award.

This simple shortbread recipe is as buttery and melt-in-the-mouth as any fancy traditional recipe. Whip up a batch and wrap them up for Christmas!



## $\overline{\mathbf{W}}$ ingredients

- 125 g caster sugar
- 125 g cornflour
- 2 cups plain flour
- 250 g butter

## method

- Preheat the oven to 170°C.
- 2. Mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl. Add the melted butter and stir until it's all combined.
- 3. Line a 28cm x 18cm lamington tin with baking paper and press the mixture in.
- 4. Bake at 170°c for 30 minutes.
- Remove from oven, cut into 24 squares, sprinkle evenly with caster sugar and prick each piece with a fork.
- 6. Return to oven for 15 minutes, Cool in tin.

- 5 cups milk
- 1 tbsp vanilla

- 1/3 cup sugar

## method

- In a cold pan, whisk the eggs, milk, vanilla and cornflour together and place over medium heat.
   Whisking constantly, bring to the boil and simmer for 2 minutes.
- 2. Whisk in the sugar and serve.

### notes

- Custard is so easy to make. The key is to add the sugar at the end. It's the sugar that
  causes custard to burn in the pan, so add it at the end helps to prevent this.
- Most commercial custards have food colouring added so this custard is a very pale yellow and not the bright yellow of pre-made custards.
